

Your Rights to Data Protection

Your rights to the protection of your personal information under the EU General Data Protection Regulation



Access to data

You have the right to know:

- what information concerning you is stored here, and why
- who has received or will receive your personal data
- Details of the origin of the data if that data wasn't collected directly from you.



Basic Information on Data

You have the right to know:

- whether your personal information is being processed
- The identity of the data controller
- The reasons for processing your personal data
- The measures taken to ensure fair and transparent processing of your data.



Compensation

- For material or non-material damage resulting from a GDPR infringement.



Rectification of data

You have the right to:

- rectify inaccurate or incomplete information about you
- know if your data has been disclosed to third parties
- be kept informed about third-party involvement in your personal data
- a response from the data controller within a month to a request you have made for rectification. (This may be extended by two months if the request is complicated.)



Complaints

You have the right to:

- lodge a complaint with a **Supervisory Authority**
- be kept informed by the Supervisory Authority on the progress and the outcome of your complaint.



Data breaches

You have the right to:

- be notified within 72 hours of any breach of your personal data
- be notified directly in the case of a breach of your personal data which is deemed of high risk to you and specific information about the steps you need to take to protect yourself



Erasure of data (right to be forgotten)

You have the right to:

- Request that your personal data is deleted
- Request that further distribution of your data ceases
- Halt the processing of your personal data by third parties

If an organisation has and maintains a lawful basis for processing your personal data, this may not be significantly affected by the right to be forgotten.



Processing of data

You have the right to:

- Object to processing of your personal data. A **Special Cases Committee** comprising independent Teachers and Assistant Teachers (in Europe) may assess your objection.
